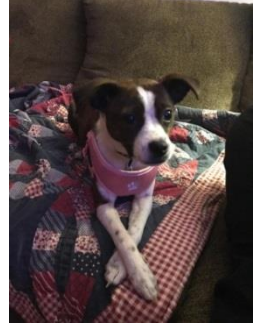
## January 2019
