We said we love Betsy and would take her if at any time he could not take care of her. With that, and after 5 minutes with Betsy, it was done! I attached a picture of the happy couple below. I can't tell you enough how good Betsy is for him, and my brothers and sisters are very relieved he now has a companion, and Betsy LOVES to run crazy 8's in the backyard. Tommy has a new Mom & Dad (not shown) and brother who is a 13 year old almost deaf and blind. This adopter is an experienced pekingese owner and understands and loves them. Tommy stopped in at the vet the day he was pulled from LOCI and I was told his eye doesn't need removed or medicine at this time. It just needs cleaned if it looks gooey. This was an old injury from a dog attack in the previous home. He may become a pirate at some point in his life, but for now he is not wearing an eye patch. Tommy will be a very spoiled boy. His owner wrote the two dogs are very respectful of each other and Tommy ignores the cat. He gets two 45 minutes walks morning and evening. She is going to follow-up with her vet about his eye and see what he needs done to be more comfortable Adopter wrote: Please pass this on to Gideon's (Tommy's) former caregiver and thank him for me. He is a wonderful little dog with a big heart and I am so glad we found each other!
