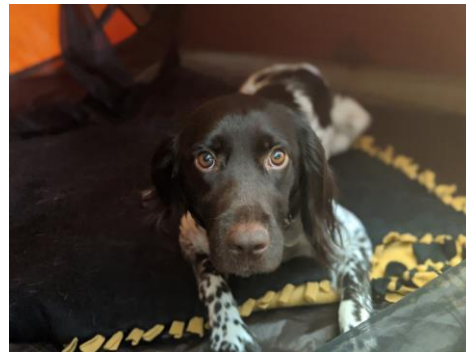
We had 12 adoptions in July and these dogs were trained in PUPP.

One year ago today I adopted Otis (aka Jude) at London Correctional. I am happy to report he transitioned easily into his new home and is a beloved member of the family. His favorite place to be is outside, where he can chase squirrels and balls, dig up mole tunnels, and nap in the shade. I am thankful that PRO recognized his potential, pulled him from the shelter, and placed him with an inmate who took his time to help make the adoption successful. I consider today's date Otis' birthday, and he was given the royal treatment - complete with presents and special treats.



From Rosa now Kora's adopters: We sent Kora to a trainer for two weeks of onsite residential training for on and off-leash skills, and she came back to us with amazing progress. We are growing trust with walking off leash, and her recall has significantly improved. The trainer used an e-collar, and we've continued with the e-collar as we see Kora improves on recall, frequency of checking while walking off-leash, and self-control around furry and feathered friends outdoors. Over the 4th of July weekend, we took her camping in the Red River Gorge, and she really thrived in her element. Returning from that trip was the first time she's seemed truly tuckered out. With quarantining still active, we've continued working from home more than originally expected. We tried to maintain consistent crate time, and she's done fairly well in the crate over the past few weeks.



Hunter is a joy to have, however still a work in progress 🐾. We introduced the crate to him and he has adapted beautifully. His insecurities seem to be subsiding and with that he seems more confident and less nervous around new people. He gets along with most other dogs, but has had issues with a few of our friend's more dominant dogs. We are working with a trainer to help with this. He comes to work with me and my husband everyday and is still obsessed with the orange frisbee.



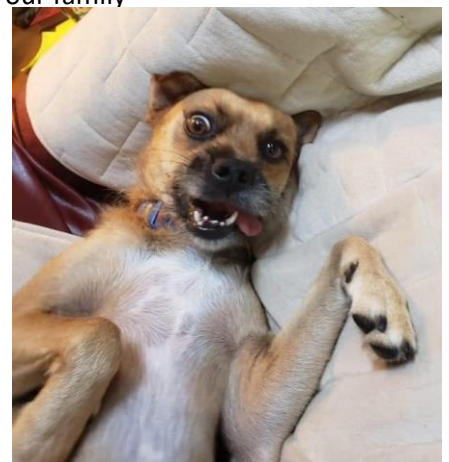
Bowie's new parents say she's doing amazing with zero issues! They are looking for another husky mix, if we get one in the rescue!

Chap is doing well and is as goofy as ever!

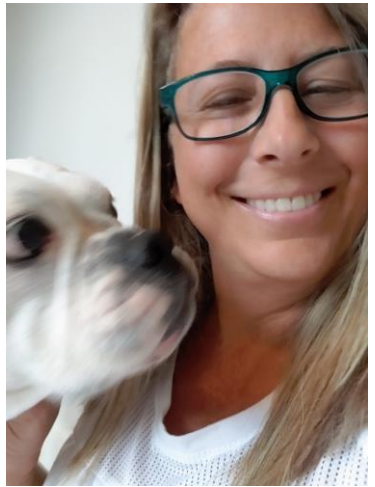
