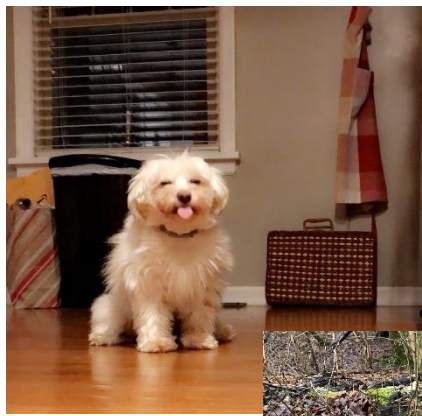

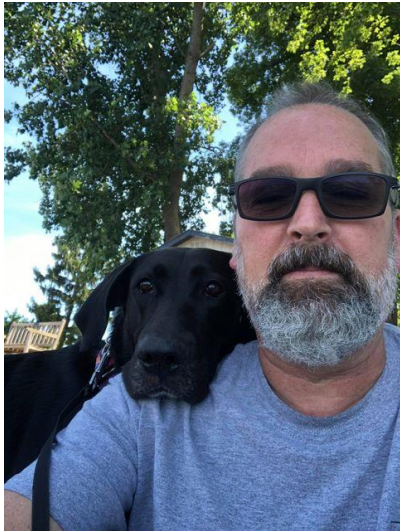

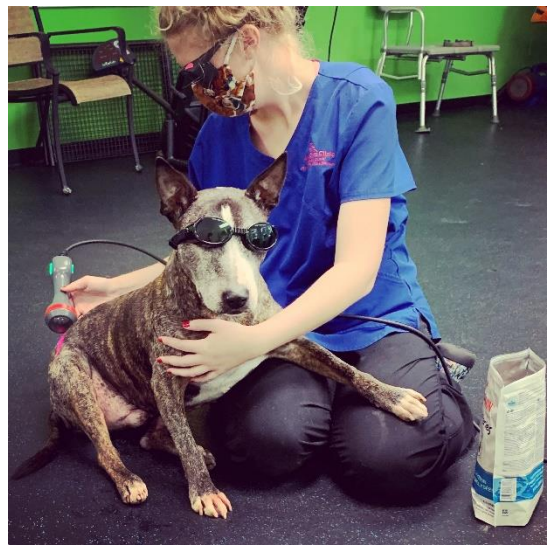

I'm still a little afraid of loud noises and it takes me a while to get comfortable with other people, but I think I'm doing better. My mommy says I need to get out of my comfort zone, so she takes me to dog parks, on long walks/hikes, we've also been a few times to Home Depot. One of the best things about that is that I get to go on a car ride! I just love driving around with my mommy by my side.

Oh, and did I mention I now have a sister? Yep! Although she's bigger than me, she acts like a little kid. She sometimes has a little too much energy for my taste, but I feel safer when we go on walks if she's by my side, so I don't really complain.
