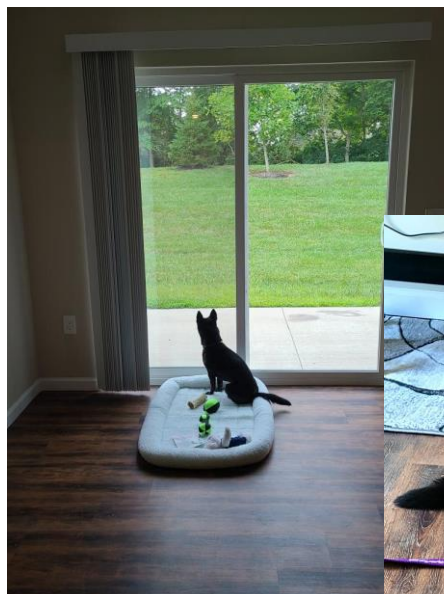

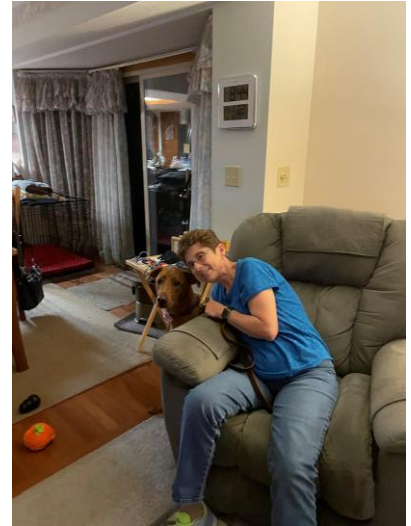

We got a couple of new photos from Mae and Gunner's adopters! They are both living the dream in their respective homes!

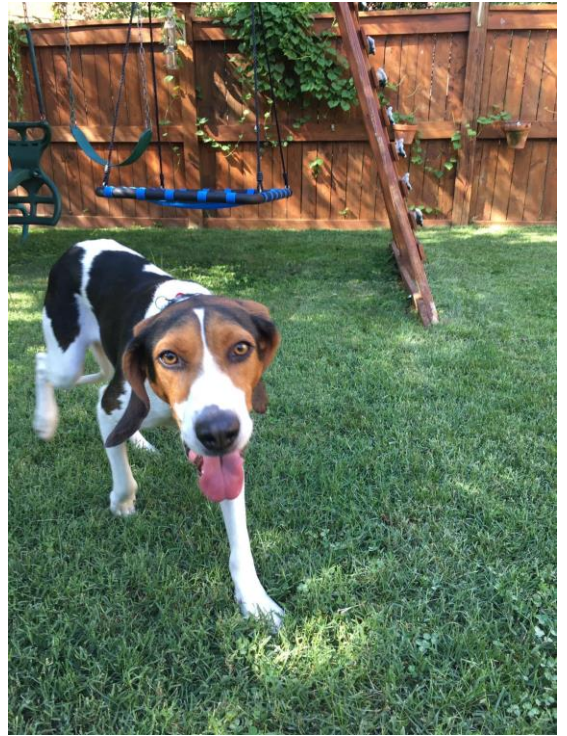




## Still in Foster:
