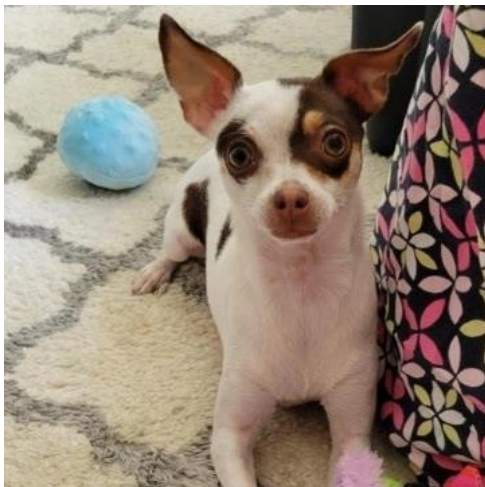

Bella (fka Spice) continues to thrive in her adoptive home with her brother Bodhi. She is still as sweet as can be and her parents love her!

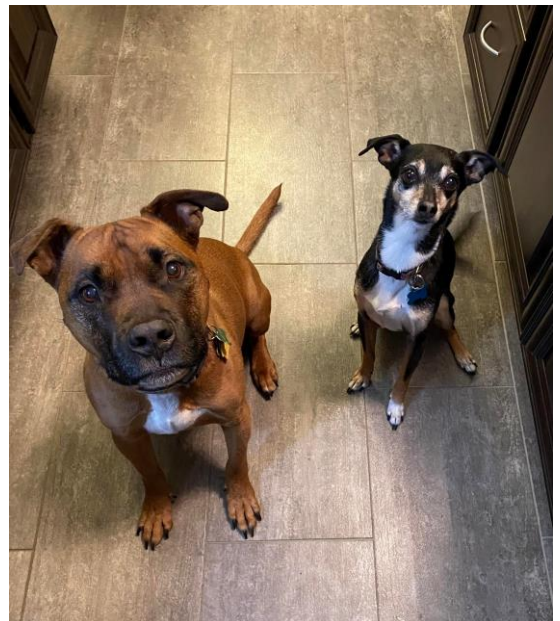


2020 PUPP Graduate Toby is enjoying his new Adirondack dog chair, which his mom won in our Fall Raffle!



Snoop may be the only definite purebred dog we sent through the program this year! His DNA results came back 100% American Bully and his mom celebrated by buying him a football jersey!

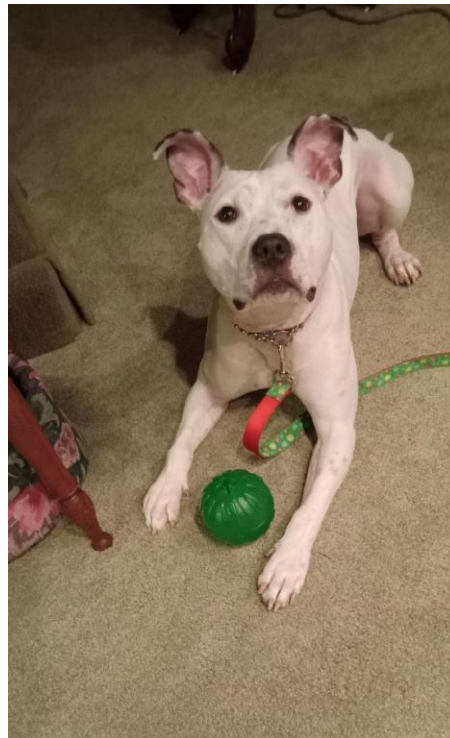
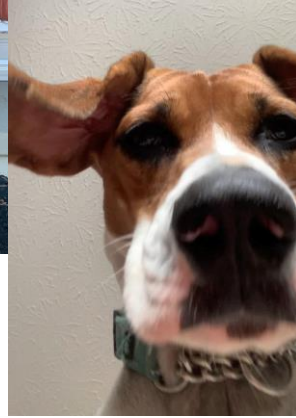

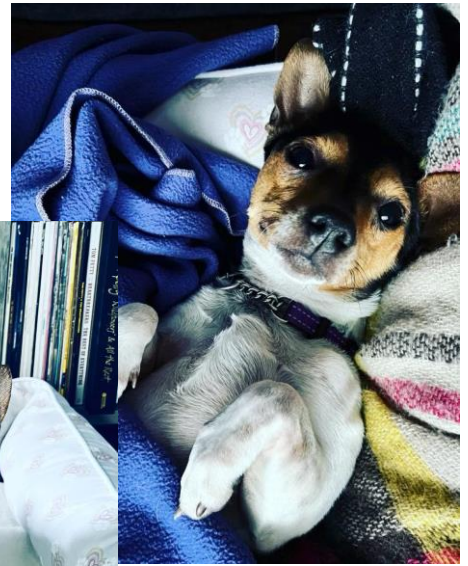


Ziggy's family loves him and he's fitting in so well! He loves looking out the window all day and has figured out how to take selfies on his mom's phone!
