For Halloween, we had an online costume contest to raise money for the rescue.




has booth for Halloween this year and he just welcomed a new human sister in December, so he's a busy boy!

Alvin's mom enjoyed the challenge of the costume contest and expanded on it with an artistic flair! Meet Salvador Doggie!




"I'm so sorry to hear that the program has been put on pause - it's now more than ever that people need companionship.

"I'm sad to hear the program is currently closed, but also understand the circumstances to not have the prison program currently. However, I hope it restarts once it's safe because we credit a lot of our success with Toby to the training he received from his handler. When we brought Toby home, we read **every.single.page** that the handler wrote and it really helped us see what his personality would be once he decompressed and gave us so much knowledge about things to look out for and where he was on his training journey. Honestly, this is the best trained dog both my roommate and I have ever had. We were afraid we'd break him at first, but we are trying to keep a balance of well trained and big personality with him.

Toby's personality continues to come out as the seasons pass, and while he is VERY chill for a Jack Russell mix, the mischievous and "play dumb" nature is definitely there a lot. As he's settled in at his forever home here in Lebanon, OH, he doesn't much care to hang out in his fenced yard but really loves his daily walks with me. He gets plenty of attention from my roommate's two teenage boys too who have benefited from having a dog during virtual schooling.

He's retained most of his commands but "leave it" is hands down the MOST handy of them all. He's VERY treat motivated still so to keep him consistent with commands like come and sit we're carrying small bags of kibble around the house and doing pop quizzes.

The most surprising thing we've learned about Toby is that he LOVES babies and toddlers. When he hears babies on the tv or sees babies while on walks he is very curious and wants to make sure he can go see them. It's pretty cute.

Oh, we also did a DNA test for Toby, because I was too curious to know how a giant, long legged Jack Russell could be made. Turns out Toby is indeed 37% JRT and his long legs come from some elders who were a collie and a German shepherd. What a weird mix still!
