2019 PUPP Graduate Charlie just celebrated his 4th birthday! He's doing great and his family loves him!








Leroy is getting a ton of exercise with his new brother, Eli! They run around the yard constantly and he's really loving toys/balls now. His parents are absolutely in love!

2021 PUPP Graduate Gunner (right) is doing so well and loves hiking with his new brother and parents! He definitely found the perfect fit!







Jesse (fka Manny) had his DNA test done and surprisingly had no Basset hound in him! He's just a potato-shaped beagle and his parents love him anyway!
